the 4th Lecturer Workshop is postponed to the new dates on
30 November – 3 December 2020, Thailand

SHAPE-SEA through ASEAN University Network-Human Rights Education (AUN-HRE) is pleased to call for participants to **the 4th Lecturer Workshop on Teaching Human Rights**. The workshop will develop lecturer skills and knowledge for teaching human rights at the undergraduate and graduate level.

The objectives are:

- Improve lecturer knowledge on fundamental concepts and theories, standards and protection of human rights
- Develop skills for teaching human rights in the university
- Introduce lecturers to textbooks and other resources for teaching human rights
- Outline methods of assessment and evaluation of students of human rights

WHO CAN APPLY?

The workshop is open to lecturers or teaching assistants in Southeast Asian Universities who are currently teaching, or plan to teach human rights in the near future. The requirements are:

- Lecturers are based at a Southeast Asian Universities
- Lecturers have an active teaching record
- Lecturers have advanced speaking and listening skills in English
- Preference will be given for people employed full time

In the selection process, balance among participants is sought in terms of gender, academic discipline and country representative.

The resource persons at the workshop are mainly drawn from Southeast Asia with experience in teaching human rights. There will be specialized sessions for lecturers teaching in law faculties, social science (including politics,



international relations, sociology, and gender studies), and development programs. Lecturers will also be trained to use the textbooks prepared by SHAPE-SEA.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships to cover tuition fee, airfare (economy flights), accommodation and food will be provided.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

For an application to be complete, the following documents must be submitted:

1. A completed **application form**
2. A **letter of organizational endorsement**, which is to be provided by a course/program director, Chair, or Dean. The letter should explain how the applicant’s participation in the program fits into the School/Faculty/University priorities and activities.

Successful candidates will be informed by mid of August 2020.
