LIVING TOGETHER: Majority-Minority Relationships in South East Asia

The ASEAN University Network-Human Rights Education (AUN-HRE) in cooperation with the Inclusive Citizenship project (www.inclusive-citizenship.no) is announcing the first short video competition with the objective of raising awareness about the human rights of minorities, focusing on the majority-minority relationships within diverse societies in South East Asian countries. The competition is open to all Southeast Asian undergraduate students who are particularly interested in critical human rights and peace issues are encouraged to apply.

ABOUT THE SHORT VIDEOS. The short video competition on **LIVING TOGETHER: Majority-Minority Relationships** aims to

- draw inspiration from 'interfaith' where stories of peaceful coexistence can be shared through video clips;
- explore and identify the practices how inclusive societies can be promoted and sustained;
- examine the consequences of practices and efforts that have been made to protect 'minorities' against any form of discrimination and abuses.

By majority-minority relationship, it refers to diverse societies where communities are identified by the diversity of religion or belief, language, and ethnicities.

ELIGIBILITY FOR JOINING THE COMPETITION

The competition is open to all undergraduate students from South East Asia and are enrolled in South East Asian higher education institutions.

REQUIREMENTS

- Title. The videos have to be made addressing the theme which is **Living Together: Majority-Minority Relationships**
- Duration 2 - 3 minutes
- Language English or any South East Asian language with sub-titles in English.
- Subtitles If the language used for interviews and interactions are in the local language/dialects then English subtitles are a must.
- Size and format Maximum 1 GB and the video file format should be MP4 or MOV file, HD quality (1920 x 1080).

MEDIUM/FORMAT FOR MAKING THE VIDEOS. Any type of camera and mobile phone to record the videos.

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

- One person can only submit one entry. Submissions are deemed final.
- The videos are to be submitted online via <https://bit.ly/3lt0ixi>
- Participants must mention the credits for the video production.

DUE DILIGENCE Participants must

- exercise due diligence to avoid harm to other persons, to avoid being insensitive to religious practices, customs and their traditional beliefs or their property.
- ensure that they do not use videos or clips from any other sources without seeking prior permission or giving due credits to the authors.
- exercise extreme caution while filming religious practices, customs and traditional beliefs if it forms part of their script. This must be done with proper and prior permission of the community leadership and relevant authorities.

SELECTION PROCESS

- Screening / Organizers' Shortlist: AUN-HRE and Inclusive Citizenship project will be reviewing and scoring all qualified entries
- Expert Panel's Choices: An esteemed group of experts will be reviewing and deciding on the top three films/video the competition.

CRITERIA FOR SELECTION The selection of the videos will be based on the following criteria:

Originality 20% Relevance to the theme 30% Content 20% Creativity 20% Technicalities (e.g. video quality, sound, light & clarity) 10%.

PRIZES AND OPPORTUNITIES

● First prize USD 1000 ● Second Prize USD 500 ● Third Prize USD 300

All winning videos will be selected for the international launch on 7th December as part of a GLOBAL online short film festival organized by the Inclusive Citizenship project (www.inclusive-citizenship.no) in Norway.
